Following on from last year's YVBSG day school, documentary evidence will be used to provide a better understanding of buildings in different areas of the Yorkshire regions: from North Yorkshire and the Wolds, the chalklands of the East Coast, to the sandstones of Halifax and the millstone grit of Todmorden, with an in-depth study of the market town of Malton. - **Enclosing the moors: shaping the Calder Valley landscape through parliamentary inclosure.** The Commons and new fields, boundary-walls, farms, roads, houses and terraces, hamlets and villages. A case-study of Stansfield and Ovenden Townships. **Sheila Graham**
- **The dual economy of textiles and agriculture, the yeoman clothier in the Upper Calder Valley in the late seventeenth century.** A case-study of a Quaker household in Shore in Stansfield above Todmorden. **Peter Thornborrow**


