

It has as its subject 'English Cruck Construction: Regional Variations' and includes a session by Barry Harrison on Documentary and Standing Crucks in Yorkshire. You don't necessarily have to be a member of VAG to attend – if there are spare places, groups such as the YVBSG which are affiliated to the VAG may send two VAG non-members, and VAG members attending the meeting may likewise introduce one non-member guest. Any other financial support available to the applicant for attending the conference must be declared. The applicant should also arrange for a letter of support to be sent directly to the VAG Secretary from someone familiar with the applicant's work in vernacular architecture.
