## Some new publications

**High Bradley: Architecture & History** by Alison Armstrong and Arnold Pacey 160pp, 59 line drawings. This new book by two YVBSG members is the result of field studies of houses and barns in their landscape setting, supported by historical research. It offers a distinctive history of the Airedale hamlet of High Bradley, as well as useful information on looking at buildings more generally.

The book looks at the architectural form and history of every building structure in High Bradley, noting how buildings and landscape together reflect the development of farming in the area, and how several industries influenced development of the hamlet, including quarrying, coal-mining, weaving and wool-combing. The history of the former manor house of Bradley is traced back to before 1500, and remains of the smaller, cruck-framed houses of the early settlement are identified.
