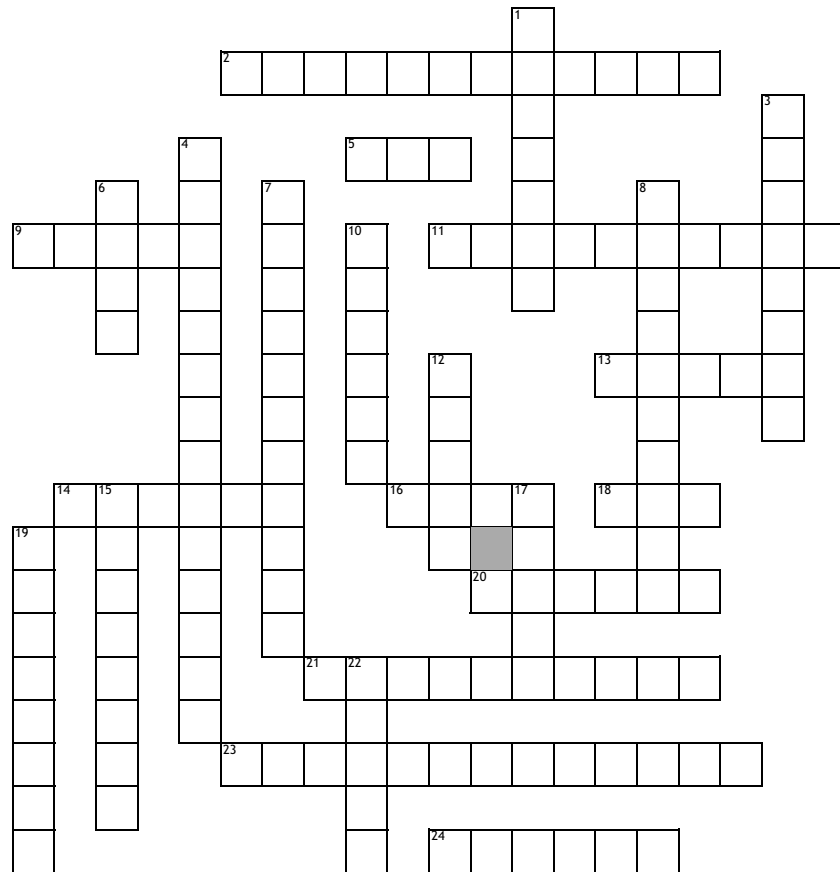


Vernacular Building Terms

2. A continuous moulding on an external wall
5. A primitive form of concrete made of chalk, mud and chopped straw
9. The stones forming the corner of a building
11. A beam connecting a pair of principal rafters at some distance above their feet
13. The upper intersection of the main slopes of a roof
14. Stone cut into smooth rectangular blocks
16. A raised platform
18. The space between two roof trusses, or between the truss and the end of the wall
20. Timber members, often curved, linking horizontal and vertical members in a roof or wall
21. The truss at the lower end of a hall, retaining aisle posts and framing the screen
23. The earliest form of infilling timber-framed partitions and walls
24. A main horizontal member in a roof

1. A carved or moulded bracket supporting a door hood or canopy
3. A half column fixed against a wall
4. The plan of a house one room deep
6. The pattern of laying bricks
7. A roof having two pitches, that of the lower part being steeper than the upper slope
8. The moulding covering the joint between a door and the adjoining wall face
10. The main external elevation of a building
12. A private withdrawing room
15. A moulding at the base of an internal wall
17. An alternative name for a brace, generally used of straight timbers
19. A vertical stone or timber supporting a handrail
22. The angle of the roof slope
